Educational Timeline

- School year: September through June; Graduation occurs in May
- All children (ages 7-16) attend a 9-year compulsory primary and lower secondary (middle) school program. When students complete the first nine years of education, they receive the Certificate of Incomplete General Secondary Education. After two years of upper secondary education, students receive the Certificate of Complete General Secondary Education.
- Upper secondary education takes place at two types of institutions: general academic school, and secondary vocational-technical schools. Distance education is available.

GPA Calculation

Calculate the cumulative high school GPA by converting line-by-line all *Atestat* and accompanying yearly reports grades listed on the "Group A" document list above. Each grade is weighted equally. Convert to US equivalents and then to quality points. Divide quality points by the total number of examination results and yearly report grades included.

Class Ranking

Class rank is evaluated based on a letter written and submitted by the headmaster or principal of the institution from which the student graduated. The letter must confirm both the student's final position in the student's secondary school class and the total number of students in the graduating class (e.g. the student is 41st in a total graduating class of 112 students). However, students completing tracked or separate degree programs (e.g. *Dyplom kvalifikovanogo robotnika*) must be ranked against all other students in a given class who completed the same degree program.

Post-Secondary Education

Students will be charged terms of attendance and considered transfer students if they have enrolled as a regular student and attended one or more courses at any of the types of institutions listed below (may not be all inclusive) or any other institution that requires proof of high school graduation as a pre-requisite for admission (subject to review on a case-by-case basis).
