Educational Timeline

- School year: September to June; Graduation occurs in June
- Primary school is six years followed by three years of lower secondary school followed by three years of upper secondary school

Group A: Documents That Meet High School Graduation Requirement

Students presenting documents other than those listed below will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis

Teudat Bagrut Matriculation Certificate
 -Must be official Ministry of Education statement of results

Teudat Gemer Tichonit Secondary School Final Diploma
 -Must be official Ministry of Education statement of results

Teudat Hagamar Hatichonit Certificate of Completion of Secondary Studies
 -Must be official Ministry of Education statement of results

Teudat Gemer Maslul Miktzoi Tichon (MASMAT) Final Diploma of the Secondary Technological and Vocational Track
 -Must be official Ministry of Education statement of results

Teudat Gemer Maslul Miktzoi Ragil (MASMAR) Final Diploma of the Regular Secondary Technological and Vocational Track
 -Must be official Ministry of Education statement of results

Group B: Documents That Do Not Meet High School Graduation Requirement

Comparable to less than completion of US high school

Teudat Gemer Maslul Mikzoi Ma'asi (MASMAM) Final Diploma of the Practical Secondary Technological and Vocational Track

GPA Calculation

Calculate the cumulative high school GPA using all exam grades earned on official certificates listed in "Group A" above. Do not include "Internal Subjects" that have hours listed instead of credits. Convert all grades listed on the certificate line-by-line to US equivalents and then to quality points. If a crediting system is used, weight the grades for each subject according to the credits assigned for that subject on the official document. If no crediting system is assigned on the official document, weight all courses equally.

Class Ranking

Class rank is evaluated based on a letter written and submitted by the headmaster or principal of the institution from which the student graduated. The letter must confirm both the student's final position in his/her secondary school class and the total number of students in the graduating class (e.g. the student is 41st in a total graduating class of 112 students). However, students completing tracked or separate degree programs (e.g. *Teudat Gemer Maslul Miktzoi Tichon MASMAT*) must be ranked against all other students in a given class who completed the same degree program.

Post-Secondary Education

Students will be charged terms of attendance and considered transfer students if they have enrolled as a regular student and attended one or more post-secondary courses at any of the types of institutions listed below (may not be all inclusive) or any other institution that requires proof of high school graduation as a pre-requisite for admission (subject to review on a case-by-case basis).
